



Once Upon a time in 2020... Education Project

LIGCA offers a unique art project focussing on children's reactions to the impact of Covid 19 that ties in with the reset curriculum, based on our global exhibition "Once Upon a Time in 2020...Childrens' Art during the pandemic"

The project can be done in two parts, A & B, but each can stand alone if time is short.

Part A Takes us into 50 years into the future to the story of Christopher and Isabella, two children who discover a treasure chest of paintings by children from around the world reflecting their experience of the Covid 19 pandemic. This is a making project with art ideas and tutorials, it links to a global online exhibition of children's art which your school can become a part of.

Part B Looks at where the pictures in LIGCA's online gallery come from and allow exploration and discussion on the global issues faced by the pandemic. Find out more about other countries and cultures and their responses to the pandemic and discover shared experiences.

Key stage 1,2,3

Artform: Visual arts

Curriculum links: Art, Craft, Literacy, Citizenship and Community, Geography, Science, PHSE

Learning outcomes:

- I create and share ideas to support reconnection
- I can relate to a global community
- I can develop and extend emotional vocabulary
- I can understand the importance of kindness and empathy
- I can express my feelings
- I can work together collaboratively
- I can identify various countries and cultures
- I can create something new and unique
- I can look at other children's art and find common values and feelings

Time Required: 2x 45-60 minutes for each part but could be developed into a much wider art project.

Preparation Time 20-30 mins to gather resources

Resources required: Paper and various art materials depending on what is available including recycled materials for collage.
